The largest landholder in this region was Robert Carter, of Corotoman, a territorial grant washed upon the east by the Chesapeake, and upon the south by the Rappahannock. The latter is a lordly stream at this point, and navigable for over a hundred miles from the mouth. John Carter, the father of Robert, built in 1670 the first Episcopal church on the Neck. His name had headed the list of parish vestrymen in 1654, preceding that of the clergyman, -- an arbitrary order followed in the cases of his namesake-son...
